Dear Mr Rickersey and City of Sydney Council

I am writing to express my strong support for Hyper Karting and its continued operation within the Entertainment Quarter car park.

Hyper Karting provides a safe, well-managed, family-friendly activity that delivers meaningful social and economic value. The venue has become a major drawcard for young people, families, and visitors. Since opening, Hyper Karting has played a significant role in revitalising the Entertainment Quarter, bringing consistent foot traffic and energy to an area that has long struggled to maintain vibrancy.

I understand that a key reason for the DA being refused was concerns raised about reclaiming parking spaces. However, this does not reflect the actual needs of the precinct. The Entertainment Quarter already has more parking than is typically required, even during major events. Replacing a thriving recreational venue with additional parking, particularly when the existing supply is under-utilised, runs counter to the City of Sydney's own policies, which aim to reduce car dependency and encourage more sustainable land use. This is especially relevant given that a new car park with over 1,000 spaces will open nearby within the next year, making the small number of spaces used by Hyper Karting negligible in the broader context.

The human impact of closure is also substantial. Shutting down Hyper Karting would result in the loss of 156 jobs, many held by young people and casual workers who rely on this employment for income, skills development, and stability. The ripple effects on local families and the community would be significant.

It is also important to recognise that Hyper Karting is not a faceless corporation but a home-grown success story. The business was built from the ground up by a local resident who has invested years of effort, personal resources, and genuine passion into creating something unique. Supporting businesses like this is essential if Sydney is to remain a city that champions local entrepreneurship, innovation, and community-driven ideas. Removing a successful local venture that has demonstrably revitalised the Entertainment Quarter sends the opposite message.

Hyper Karting contributes far more to the area than the modest parking footprint it occupies. It supports local employment, strengthens the Entertainment Quarter, provides a healthy and engaging activity for residents, and exemplifies the kind of local innovation the city should be proud to champion. I strongly encourage Council to reconsider its position in this matter.

To whom it may concern,

I strongly oppose the closure of Hyper Karting in favour of "296 car spots." They've presented very clear evidence of the unnecessary nature of opening these places, nor does it present Sydney as moving forward in its goal of promoting public infrastructure and transportation, especially in a world where our future becomes increasingly weary of the impacts of light transport vehicles to CO2 emissions. According to the NTC, recorded in January 2025, the average emissions intensity has decreased ~3.9% from 162.7g/km to 156.3g/km. Whilst this isn't the primary point of the argument, it's to present that our city has evidently been shifting its focus towards lower emissions and greater eco-friendly transport, and it's unfortunate that our efforts lie in increasing and exacerbating dependence on light vehicle transport through 'useless' parking space expansions such as this.

Nevertheless, Hyper Karting has been an experience which I have also personally attended alongside my friends, and one of the few places that we've gone on multiple occasions in the Entertainment Quarter. I've seen many families, some I've seen on multiple occasions, attend and have their kids enjoy the experience. It's pretty unique, and to a similar scale there is nothing like it in Sydney. It's unfortunate that such a unique attraction is instead being replaced by redundant spots, when it could otherwise be serviced so well by this small business.

I urge you to reconsider, take your community's call into action, and truly understand the actions being taken. 296 spaces is not worth the attraction, joy, and uniqueness which Hyper Karting otherwise presents.

Dear Shannon,

I am writing to express my disappointment at the news of the possible closure of Hyper Karting.

As a mother of two boys under 10, we have visited Hyper Karting many times since it opened, including for birthday parties, and have always had a wonderful experience. In fact, it is often the primary reason we visit the Entertainment Quarter as a family.

The location is incredibly convenient—close to the city and easily accessible by both car and light rail from the Inner West, where we live. **It is also the only go-karting venue we can attend regularly, as it uniquely caters to younger children.** I first took my sons when they were just 3 and 6 years old.

Most other tracks do not cater at all to under-13s; if they do, they have very limited availability, require group bookings, and/or are located far away.

Being in the Entertainment Quarter lets us combine a visit to Hyper Karting with other area activities, making it more appealing and valuable for families and big kids alike!

In my experience, parking availability has never been an issue, and I regularly attend music and sporting events at EQ venues. My only criticism relates to exiting the car park, where traffic flow and signage can be challenging on busy nights, and where there is no supervision or staff to assist with the process.

A recent example, after attending G Flip at the Hordern Pavilion on Tuesday, 3 March, it took my friends and I over an hour to exit the car park. We found a space easily (not even on the top level), but the delay in leaving was frustrating and made for a horrible end to an otherwise enjoyable evening—especially on a weekday. I also had a similar but slightly shorter exit time when we attended Benee at Liberty Hall in February 2026. **Both these experiences and others suggest the parking issue lies more with traffic management at the exit than with overall parking capacity.**

I have also attended numerous events at the SCG and Allianz Stadium, both by car and public transport, and have not experienced significant access issues beyond the same exit congestion.

I strongly urge you to reconsider this decision. Hyper Karting provides a unique, accessible, and family-friendly activity that enhances the Entertainment Quarter's appeal throughout the day and year. I hope it continues as my boys get older and more independent.

It is a valued destination for many families like ours, and its loss would be deeply felt by many, including the wonderful staff.

I'm writing on behalf of Josh Oliver, a regular patron of Hyper Karting at the Entertainment Quarter, to oppose the council's decision to deny the venue's lease extension.

Hyper Karting has transformed an underutilised rooftop car park into one of Sydney's most popular entertainment destinations — attracting over 500,000 visitors, employing more than 150 people, and serving as a community hub for families, youth programs, and disability groups.

The justification of restoring 298 parking spaces is particularly difficult to understand given that the Entertainment Quarter car park has only reached full capacity a handful of times across 84 major events, and a new 1,500-space underground car park at Allianz Stadium is set to open shortly.

Removing a thriving business and community asset to create parking spaces that will sit empty runs directly counter to the council's own vision of making Sydney a city for people, not cars — and undermines the NSW Government's efforts to revitalise the Entertainment Quarter as a year-round destination.

To Whom It May Concern,

Entertainment Quarter Car Park, Moore Park

I write as a Randwick resident and regular patron of Hyper Karting in support of approving the venue's continued operation at the Entertainment Quarter car park, Moore Park.

I visit Hyper Karting frequently, typically alongside other local residents, and take my children there regularly. It is a well-run, modern facility that serves a genuinely broad cross-section of the community including families, young adults, and enthusiasts alike, and contributes meaningfully to an area that has few comparable entertainment options.

On the question of parking, I would respectfully submit that the Council's concerns are not borne out by real-world conditions. I personally used the Entertainment Quarter car park over the Easter long weekend this year, during which the Children's Easter Show was simultaneously running at the adjacent showground. Even under those conditions, a family-oriented event that draws significant crowds to the immediate precinct, parking was readily available and I experienced no difficulty whatsoever. If the car park functions adequately during one of the busiest family events on Sydney's calendar, the contention that 298 spaces are critically needed is difficult to sustain. This is before accounting for the additional parking supply coming online in the area, and the well-established modal shift driven by light rail and bus access to Moore Park.

Beyond parking, the case for keeping Hyper Karting open is compelling on its merits. The venue has welcomed over 500,000 visitors since opening in 2021, supports over 150 jobs, and provides programming for NDIS participants and community groups. As a father who brings his children there, I can attest to how rare and valuable a genuinely family-friendly entertainment venue of this quality is in Sydney's inner east.

I would also urge the Council to consider the broader character of the Moore Park precinct. It was not long ago that this area was lifeless and uninviting, the kind of place Sydneysiders drove past rather than to. The increased foot traffic that venues like Hyper Karting have generated has transformed that. Closing it in favour of an empty level of car parking would be a significant step backwards, returning the precinct to exactly the soulless character that residents and visitors alike have been glad to see the back of.

Closing a thriving, well-patronised venue to recover underutilised parking runs counter to every stated objective of Sydney's night-time and entertainment economy strategy. I urge Council to approve the extension.

To Hon Clover Moore AO - Lord Mayor of Sydney, and Shannon Rickersey - City of Sydney Council,

I'm a City of Sydney resident who first went to Hyper Karting for a bucks party a few years ago. Since then, I've been back several times and more importantly I've taken groups, gone with other groups, on a date night and been to both of their venues within the Entertainment Quarter.

The venue has provided me, and others, a space to be able to go and experience some good quality, all weather and safe entertainment close to the CBD. In fact looking online, it seems that the closest go karting is Play Spitfire, Concord West - not close.

While thinking about this email, there were 100 things I wanted to say, but I'll try keep it under just a few topics.

CBD Entertainment

This venue is one of the few affordable things that anyone can do close to the CBD, and somewhere that younger people love to go.

- While Museums and Libraries are exciting, they are really a once and done style place, and not really a 17 year old's birthday party venue.
- Madame Tussauds and Sea Life are \$49 & \$55 per adult placing a family day out in the higher price range - and again are a one and done venue.
- Luna Park, outside your council area, if I was to book this week, it has an average adult price of \$62 for their park pass.

Hyper Karting's races start at \$24 with the average 'day' price of \$29, and the track changes every few days allowing you to go back and experience something different nearly every time.

Sustainability

Hyper Karting is a 100% electric go-karting experience. With the cost of fuel these days, temporary or not, other venues like Play Spitfire are going to have to either increase their prices massively or go under.

This will further reduce the accessibility of these venues, and your 218,096 (June 2022) residents will also need to make the long trip to access these services, again making the day out rather expensive.

Every council wants to be working towards ZERO emissions, and right now, the City of Sydney has this advantage over others by being able to call Sydney the Home of Electric GoKarting.

The Entertainment Quarter (EQ)

This is probably my biggest one, and it doesn't actually have anything to do with Hyper Karting.

The EQ is in a weird spot where there are always heaps of venues there, food and otherwise, but honestly - I already have 3 cinemas really close to me. I've got arcades, darts, and everything I need living in the heart of the CBD.

There would be absolutely no reason for me to venture to EQ if Hyper Karting wasn't there, and I would argue that there are many others in the same situation.

This would have a serious impact on all other venues in the EQ with the reduced attendance.

My first venture to HyperKarting was with a bucks party (~25 people) and after HyperKarting we went to Strike Bowling, and to laser in the same venue. We then went and ate at El Camino Cantina and ventured to another 2 venues for drinks before heading off.

I would also argue that a high percentage of people that attend this venue would also stay to spend money at other

EQ businesses for lunch, dinner or a drink before or after.

Short of HyperKarting, there is no reason for me to go to EQ, meaning that other businesses in the EQ loose out as well.

Lord Mayor, Clover Moore

This proposal was rejected, in part, because the proposal is "**not in the public interest**". I challenge you to provide reasons as to how it isn't.

On the 19 March 2025, when discussing the draft Entertainment Sound Management Development Control Plan, you said Sydney needs "**a nightlife we can be proud of**" and said the proposed reforms would make it easier for venues to trade later and create "**new, fun and affordable options**" for people going out at night.

Then in March 2026, you said the community had asked council to let some areas "trade even later" and that **council had listened**.

While these are not directly related to HyperKarting and this DA, this only strengthens the argument that people in your electorate are wanting entertainment venues that are **fun** and **affordable**. Given my cost examples earlier - HyperKarting meets all these objectives.

Reviews online state "**LOVE this place! A great experience for people of all ages.**" and "**We loved our experience at Hyper Karting! If you want a great family experience and love to go fast, this is the venue for you!**"

How can you let a unique experience that's already in the council area slip by? What value do you attach to attracting these businesses to operate in the council area? What is going to replace the hole in the market their loss will create?

How will you bring 500,000 people to the entertainment quarter in the next 12 months to replace the people that wont attend because Hyper Karting wont be there?

Cars & Parking

Over the last 10 years, the council has done an amazing job of removing cars from the CBD. Every year more and more roads have had a lane removed, are closed to traffic or another measure to reduce traffic implemented.

Lastly, the price of fuel means people are going to be using their cars less and less.

The long and short of this is the loss of Hyper Karting to the area would have a direct impact on all the other venues in the EQ, would mean that I have one less place to take interstate and overseas travelers to and means I would loose the ability to go Go-Karting close by.

Please reconsider your decision and extend their lease. At a minimum, give them another year and do your due diligence with surveys to patrons about their other spending and travel habits within all EQ venues.

It's not like they will be replaced with another attraction, they will be replaced with car parks - something that doesn't attract any further patrons to the EQ complex.

I'd like you to consider the economic ramifications of kicking them out of the car park. Hyper Karting employs over 150 people, has brought in more than 500,000 visitors, and runs seven days a week pumping real money into the surrounding businesses. The 298 parking spaces it sits on are on Level 5 of a 2,003-space car park that - according to Transport for NSW data - has only hit full capacity a handful of times since Allianz Stadium reopened.

So we'd be losing a thriving small business, 150+ jobs, and one of Moore Park's most popular attractions - all to get back a rooftop that'll sit empty almost every day of the year. That's not a good trade for anyone.

Dear Lord Mayor and Councillors,

I write as a regular visitor to Hyper Karting at the Moore Park Entertainment Quarter to formally oppose the Council's decision to deny an extension of the venue's operating approval.

Since opening in 2021, Hyper Karting has attracted over 500,000 visitors and become the most popular daily attraction in the Entertainment Quarter. It is home to Australia's longest indoor electric go-kart track, serves families, young people, and corporate groups alike, and supports more than 150 jobs. Its loss would leave a significant void in one of Sydney's key entertainment precincts.

The stated justification — reclaiming 298 car park spaces — is not proportionate. The Entertainment Quarter is directly accessible by light rail and bus, and Moore Park is precisely the kind of high-density entertainment precinct where active encouragement of public transport use should be a policy priority. Restoring 298 spaces to an already large and underutilised car park undermines that goal, and does nothing to address the genuine event-day congestion caused by the car park's bottlenecked single-lane exit. The answer to parking pressure around the SCG and Allianz Stadium is not more spaces — it is better promotion of the excellent public transport connections that already exist.

This decision also contradicts the NSW Government's stated commitment to revitalising Sydney's entertainment and night-time economy. Closing a venue that operates seven days a week, is well-served by light rail, and draws consistent year-round patronage sends entirely the wrong signal.

I respectfully ask the Council to:

1. Approve at minimum the requested two-year extension to allow time for a longer-term solution to be developed.
2. Engage in genuine consultation with Hyper Karting operators and the community before any final decision is made.
3. Redirect focus toward promoting public transport to Moore Park rather than prioritising car parking over a thriving community venue.

I am writing to express my concern about the proposed removal of Hyper Karting at the Entertainment Quarter in Moore Park.

From what I understand, the main reason this venue may be forced to close is due to the loss of car parking spaces, rather than any issues with noise, safety, or impact on the surrounding area. This feels like the wrong priority for a precinct that is meant to be focused on entertainment, experiences, and public life.

Hyper Karting has become a really popular and unique attraction in Sydney. It brings people into the area, supports local businesses, and adds something genuinely fun and different to the city's entertainment offering. Losing it would make the precinct less vibrant and less appealing, especially for younger people and groups looking for social activities.

It's also important to consider that:

- The go-karting operates inside an existing structure and doesn't require new development
- It uses electric karts, meaning minimal noise and environmental impact
- The space it occupies appears to have previously been underused as car parking

In a city that is trying to move toward better public transport use and more activated spaces, it seems counterproductive to remove a successful entertainment venue just to restore car parking—especially if that parking is not consistently needed.

Moore Park and the Entertainment Quarter should be evolving into places where people want to spend time, not just places to store cars.

I strongly encourage Council to reconsider this decision and support the continuation of Hyper Karting, or at the very least explore a more balanced approach that doesn't prioritise unused parking over a thriving community asset.
