I am writing in support of Hyper Karting at Moore Park and urge City of Sydney to support its continued operation.

Hyper Karting provides real value to Sydney as a social, recreational, and community venue. I have personally gone there on dates, spent time there with friends, and also used it for work related events. My office is based in Surry Hills, within the City of Sydney, and Hyper Karting has been a genuine option for bringing people together both socially and professionally.

What makes this decision especially frustrating is that I specifically use public transport to get there. City of Sydney has invested heavily in trams, cycling, and public transport, and that policy direction is meant to encourage people to leave their cars at home. I have done exactly that. I take the tram to Hyper Karting. Removing a venue that people actively access by public transport, on the basis of preserving parking, feels inconsistent with the broader transport vision the city has been promoting.

Hyper Karting is exactly the kind of destination that should be encouraged. It activates the precinct, gives people a reason to visit Moore Park, supports social connection, and contributes to the local economy. It is also a venue that can support informal gatherings, social outings, and work events for people and businesses based in the city. We ran a work event there last year for 20 people, then spent money at local food outlets adjacent to the venue. Without Hyper Karting, we would not have gone to Moore Park.

I also think there is a broader city building issue here. Sydney should not be moving toward a model where more and more urban space is preserved purely for cars. We do not want to become a city shaped by endless parking lots. Hyper Karting does something rare and valuable. It takes a space that many people would otherwise experience as just another car park and turns it into something social, active, memorable, and useful. That feels far more aligned with the kind of city Sydney says it wants to be.

In many ways, this venue is a strong example of the City of Sydney vision in practice. It gives people a reason to use public transport, brings life into an otherwise unremarkable space, and creates a destination that people actually want to visit. That should be seen as a success, not a problem.

If the concern is parking pressure, that should be managed in a balanced way rather than shutting down a popular and well used venue. I strongly support the continuation of Hyper Karting and ask that the public value of this venue, including the fact that people can and do access it by tram and other transport options, be given proper weight in the decision.

I am writing in my capacity as a Support Coordinator to advocate for the continuation of a local hyperkarting facility that is due to close. This venue has become a vital community resource, particularly for individuals living with disability, including one of the participants I currently support, Shane Drake.

For Shane, who lives with an intellectual disability and Complex Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (c-PTSD), hyperkarting is far more than a recreational activity. It represents a safe, structured, and meaningful way to engage in the community. The predictable environment, clear rules, and individual nature of the activity provide a rare opportunity for him to participate in something that promotes confidence, independence, and emotional regulation without triggering the distress typically associated with crowded or unpredictable settings.

As you may be aware, individuals with psychosocial and cognitive disabilities often face significant barriers to community participation. Traditional social or recreational environments can be overwhelming, leading to withdrawal, isolation, and deterioration in mental health. In contrast, this hyperkarting venue has provided an accessible and inclusive space where Shane can engage at his own pace (with the support of his support worker), supported by familiar routines and minimal social pressure. This has had a demonstrably positive impact on his wellbeing, motivation, and overall quality of life.

The proposed closure of this facility is therefore of significant concern. The loss of such a unique and supportive environment is likely to result in reduced community engagement, increased social isolation, and a decline in mental health and functional capacity for Shane and potentially others in similar circumstances. There are very limited alternative activities that offer the same combination of structure, accessibility, and personal interest, making this venue particularly difficult to replace.

From an NDIS perspective, access to meaningful community-based activities is essential in achieving the scheme's core objectives of promoting social and economic participation. Facilities such as this play a critical role in enabling participants including Shane to build capacity, maintain routine, and engage in activities that align with their goals and interests. Without access to appropriate community infrastructure, the effectiveness of funded supports is significantly diminished.

I respectfully urge the Council to consider the broader community impact of this closure, particularly for individuals living with disability who rely on such spaces to participate safely and meaningfully in their local community. Exploring options to retain, relocate, or support the continuation of this facility would make a substantial difference in preserving inclusive opportunities for vulnerable community members.

I am writing to express my concern regarding the proposed closure of Hyper Karting, located within the Entertainment Quarter at Moore Park.

Hyper Karting is not just another commercial tenant—it is a unique recreational facility that delivers significant social, economic, and community value. As an indoor, electric-powered go-karting venue, it provides a safe, environmentally conscious, and weather-independent activity for a wide range of age groups, from young children through to adults. The venue caters to families, youth, corporate groups, and community events, making it one of the few inclusive, multi-generational entertainment options in the area.

Importantly, the facility has been designed with modern technology, including German-engineered electric karts that eliminate fumes and reduce noise, offering a cleaner alternative to traditional motorsport. It also operates multiple track formats for different age groups and skill levels, ensuring accessibility and safety for all participants.

Beyond recreation, Hyper Karting contributes meaningfully to the local economy. The business employs an estimated 50–200 staff and supports surrounding hospitality and retail operators by increasing foot traffic to the precinct. It is also a destination venue for corporate events, team-building activities, and celebrations, bringing consistent patronage into the area throughout the week—not just during major events.

The proposal to replace this facility with additional car parking raises several concerns. While parking is important, it is a passive land use that does not actively contribute to community wellbeing, youth engagement, or local economic vibrancy in the same way an active entertainment venue does. In fact, retaining recreational facilities like Hyper Karting can help stagger visitor departure times after major events, potentially easing congestion rather than worsening it.

At a time when there is increasing emphasis on creating activated, experience-driven urban spaces, removing a unique attraction such as this appears counterproductive. Cities thrive when they offer diverse activities that encourage people to stay longer, engage more deeply, and return frequently.

I respectfully urge the council to reconsider this decision and explore alternative solutions that allow both infrastructure needs and community amenities to coexist. Preserving Hyper Karting would demonstrate a commitment to supporting local business, fostering community engagement, and maintaining vibrant public spaces.

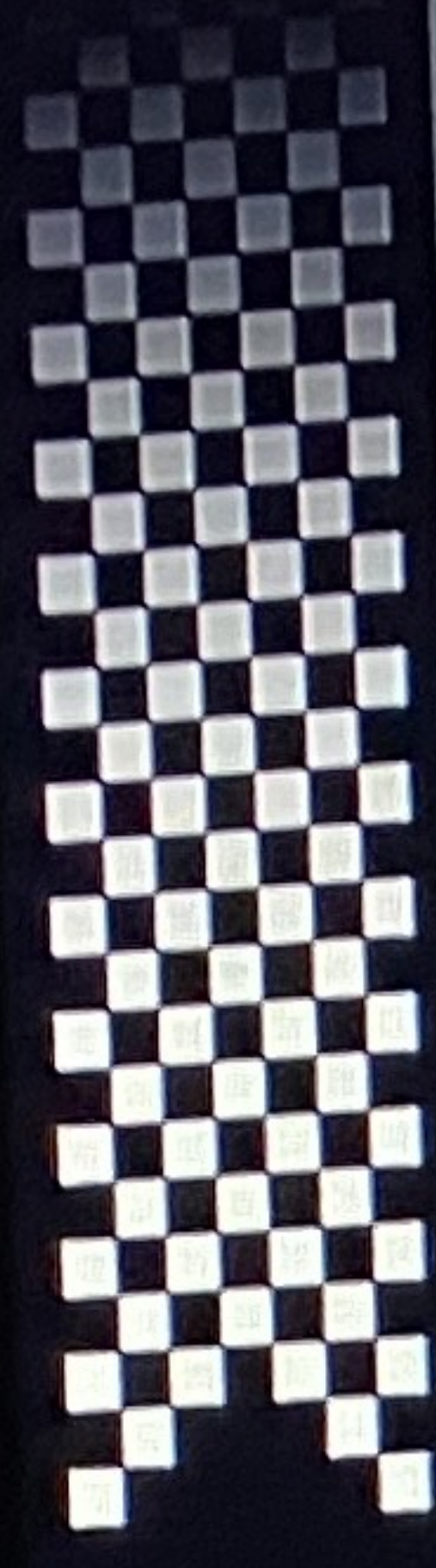

I am writing to express my extreme frustrations that the City of Sydney appears to be refusing to support this established and thriving business and, indeed, an attraction for tourists and locals, on the basis of arbitrary planning considerations.

I'm a lifetime Sydney resident living here with my partner and her two children.

Hyperkarting at Moore Park has become a regular family activity for us. We visit several times a year, and we're not stopping. It's genuinely one of the best entertainment options Sydney has to offer, particularly given that entertainment options for us adults were decimated by the disastrous lockdown laws enacted in 2014. As for the kids, they love it.

More importantly, it's the only reason we go to the Entertainment Quarter.

When we're there for karting, we visit other venues: restaurants, the cinema, shops. Without Hyperkarting as the drawcard, we simply won't make the trip, as we have better options locally. I am sure we are not alone in this.

The decision to close Hyperkarting to recover 298 parking spaces that sit empty most of the time defies logic. Rigid adherence to "car parks are for parking" ignores the obvious commercial, social and cultural benefit this facility delivers to the community. It also evidently misses the point of an "Entertainment Quarter", perhaps we should rename it the parking district.

Meanwhile, you're eliminating 150 jobs and the Quarter's most popular year-round attraction. The flow-on impact to other businesses in the precinct will be significant.

Hyperkarting serves locals and tourists alike, operates every day of the year, and has attracted over 500,000 visitors since opening. The City has spent fortunes creating events that don't come close to doing this much for the community.

If Sydney cannot support thriving attractions like this in favour of largely unused parking spaces (aren't we meant to be prioritising public transport?), we will continue to lose status as a global destination. This appears to be yet another example of local government deprioritising entertainment and culture.

In the strongest possible terms, I support Hyper Karting in their application for an extension.

I am alarmed at the decision to not extend HyperKartings use of the space that it currently has at Moore Parks Entertainment quarter. I have attended get togethers and functions at the entertainment quarter and am often left wondering what more can be done with the empty space on other levels for a night out, however that thought is usually accompanied with the pleasure of knowing that space is being used effectively by the hyper karting team.

Frankly, removing HyperKarting from running its operations 7 days a week to accommodate the very occasional large scale event is short sighted, and not conducive to a long term and vibrant environment/community in the area. It would also be a statement that the council is unable to plan long term for a growing and diverse community, which I don't believe to be the message you want to share.

I am writing as an employee of Hyper Karting at Moore Park to respectfully ask that Council reconsider the decision affecting the venue.

I have worked at Hyper Karting for more than two years, and during that time I have seen firsthand the value it brings to the Moore Park precinct. It is not only a great place to work, but also a venue that attracts people to the area and provides customers with a fun, safe and memorable experience. Many of our customers genuinely enjoy what Hyper Karting offers and often return with friends, family and work groups.

I understand that Council's main concern relates to parking. However, based on my experience working on site, I have very rarely seen the car park actually full. On busier days, the main issue often appears to be the traffic lights at the exit, which can slow cars leaving the area and make congestion seem worse than it really is.

I also believe it is important to consider the broader context. The government has already invested billions of dollars into the light rail network to encourage people to travel to Moore Park by public transport rather than relying on cars. (Despite attending many events at the SCG and Allianz stadium) These visits have then usually included trips to other businesses in the precinct such as Watsons for lunch or Ben and Jerry's for ice cream. Submission regarding proposed redevelopment impacting HyperKarting, Moore Park

To whom it may concern,

I am writing to express my opposition to the proposed redevelopment that would result in the removal of HyperKarting at Moore Park.

The current site is already a multi-level car park, with HyperKarting operating within it. As such, the proposal effectively removes a well-used and unique attraction in order to replace an existing, functioning car park with another car park offering unnecessary additional capacity - an outcome that is difficult to justify from a community perspective.

HyperKarting is a genuinely valuable part of the Moore Park precinct. I have visited many times with different groups including friends and family, and it has consistently been busy and enjoyable. It's one of the few activities in the area that gives people a reason to come beyond major events, and it adds energy and life to the precinct.

Importantly, it also attracts traffic to the other businesses in the area. When we go, we often spend time at other nearby businesses after HyperKarting - food, drinks, or just walking around the area. In that sense, HyperKarting acts as a drawcard that supports the wider local economy and makes the precinct feel more active and engaging.

In contrast, increasing car park capacity feels like a much less valuable outcome. Moore Park is already a well-established public transport destination, with the light rail and event-based transport strategies designed specifically to reduce reliance on private vehicles. Expanding parking capacity also risks inducing additional car traffic, which is inconsistent with contemporary planning principles focused on sustainability, congestion reduction, and mode shift toward public and active transport.

There is also a question of whether this represents a good use of public resources. Replacing an existing, functional structure - while removing a popular and well-used attraction within it - seems difficult to justify from a ratepayer perspective. It's not clear what meaningful additional value is being created for the community compared to what would be lost.

It would be disappointing to see a decision like this made without strong community support, given how well-used and appreciated HyperKarting clearly is.

I strongly urge council to reconsider this proposal and explore alternatives that retain HyperKarting.
