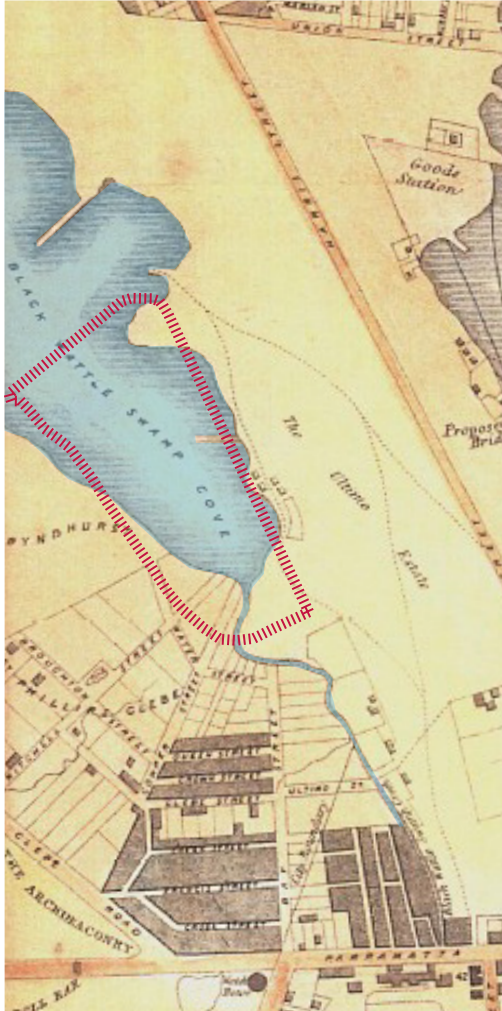

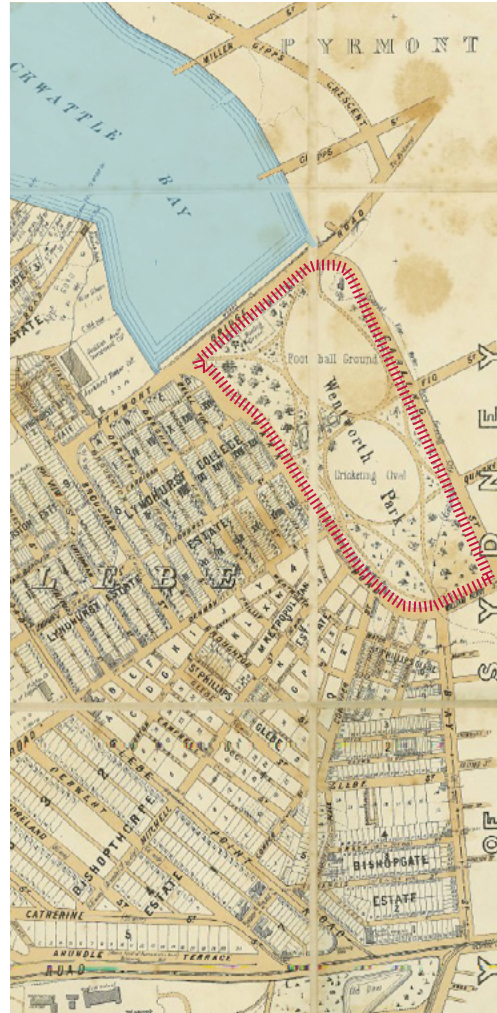

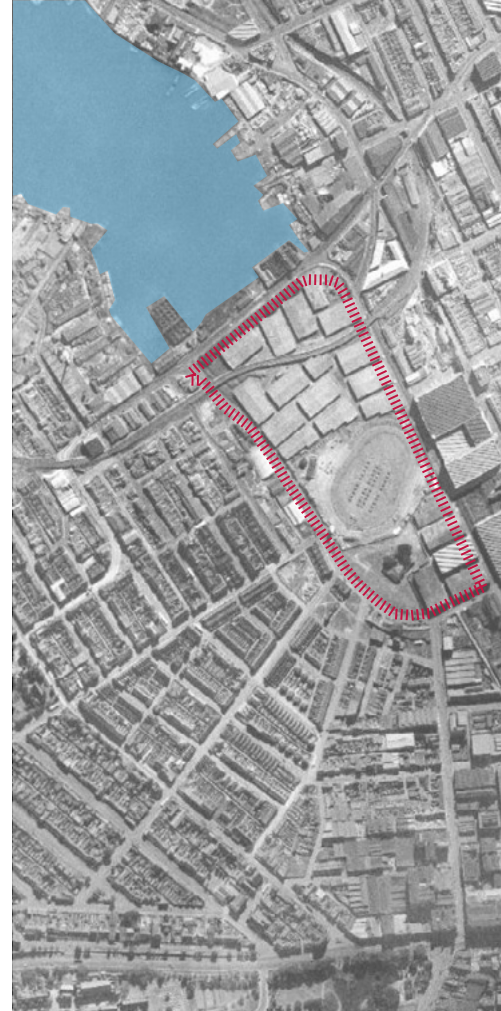
Map of Sydney and Suburbs, 1855

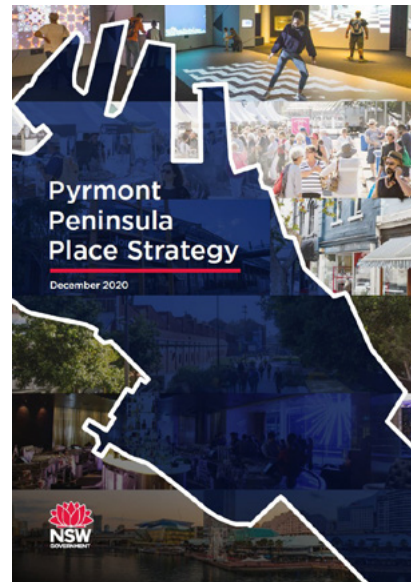

Pymont Peninsula Place Strategy 2020

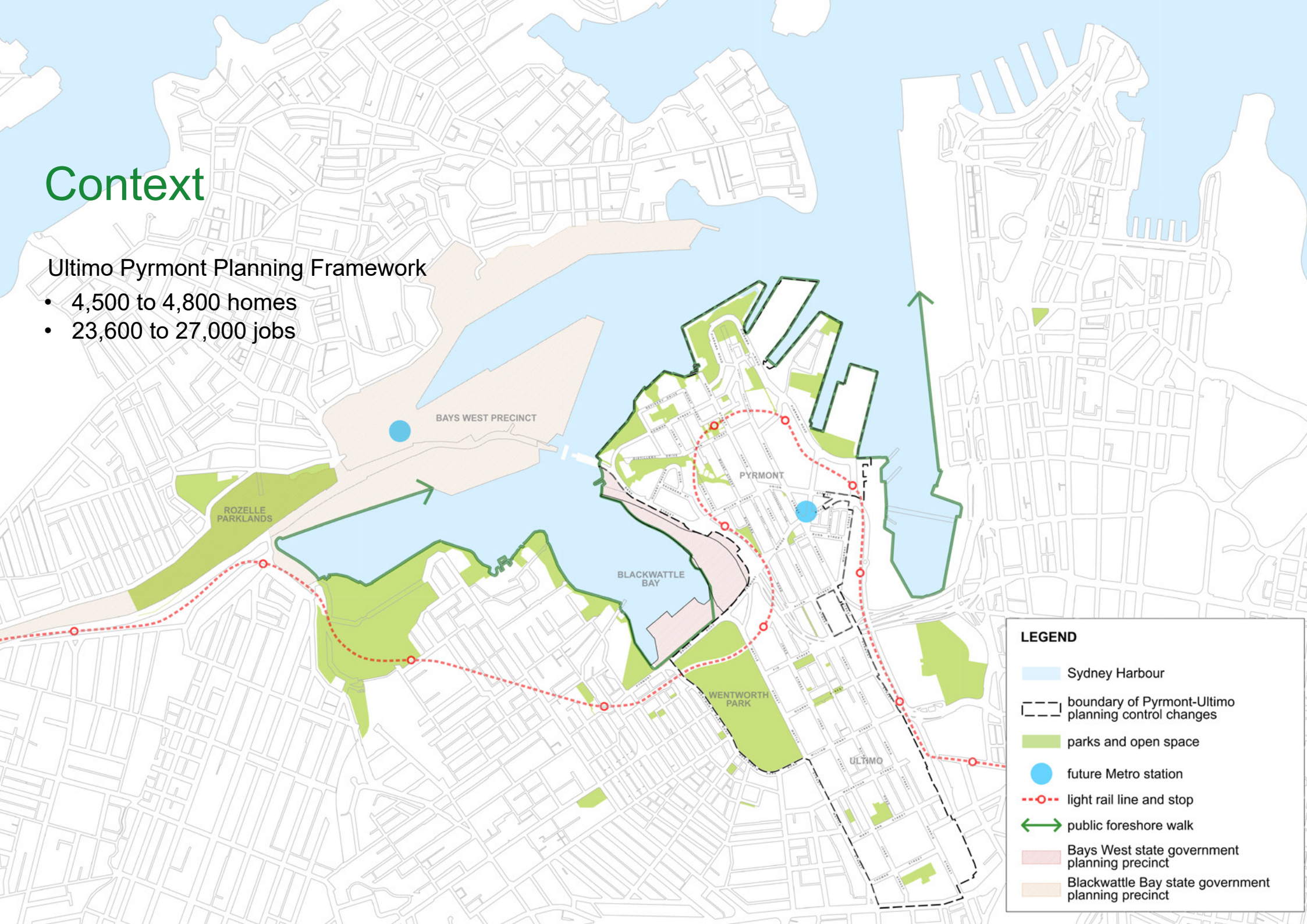

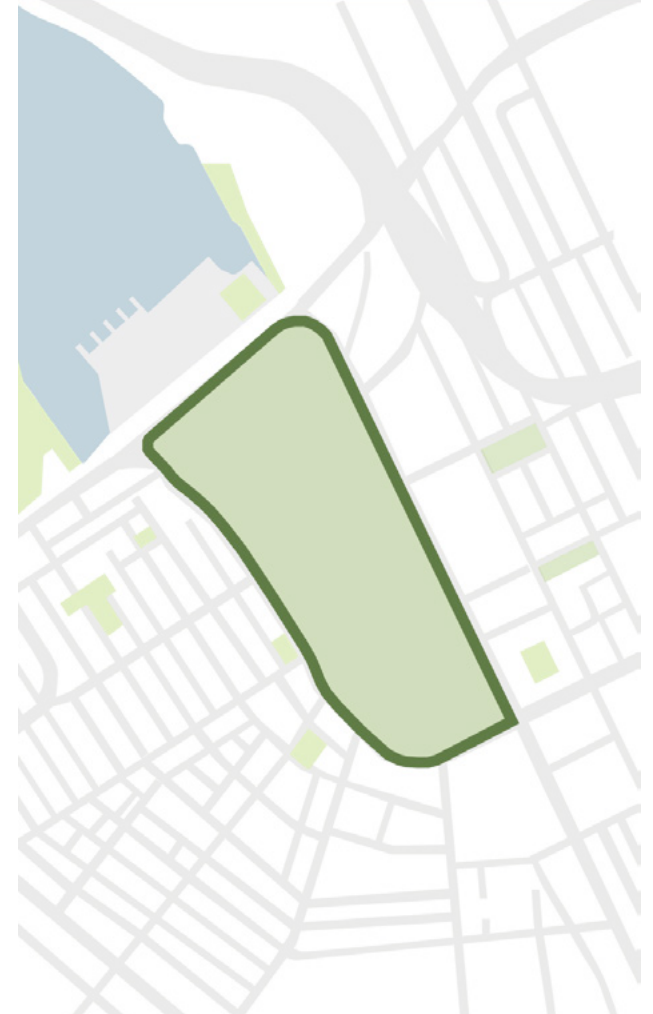
